CFA-SUPPORTED COALITIONS IN BIRMINGHAM AND EL PASO RECEIVE RECOMPETE DESIGNATION FROM THE U.S DEPT. OF COMMERCE

Birmingham, AL and El Paso, TX: Coalitions in Birmingham, Alabama and El Paso, Texas have been selected as finalists of the Economic Development Administration's (EDA) Recompete pilot program. This is the most competitive program in EDA's history with only 10% of over 200 applicants recognized as finalists. The Community Funding Accelerator (CFA) supported both cities' coalitions in the application process and will continue to provide assistance as they apply for \$20 to \$50 million in funding in phase 2 of the program.

CFA played a pivotal role in the success of both Birmingham and EI Paso's coalitions by facilitating engagement of various local partners. This collaboration is key to tackling regional challenges, focusing on strengthening K-12 education and workforce pathways, thereby readying the community and creating robust talent pipelines for future jobs. CFA's contribution was not just limited to partnerships; CFA also provided deep technical assistance and expert grant writing support, critical elements in development and submission of their successful applications.

The Recompete program invests in economically distressed communities across the U.S., generating quality jobs, strengthening workforce pathways, and creating renewed economic opportunity for communities where prime-age employment falls well below the national average. As Recompete finalists, the coalitions in Birmingham and El Paso will be invited to apply for phase 2 funding, which awards 4-8 winning communities an average of \$20-\$50M in federal funding. Additionally, they will have access to EDA-provided technical support to strengthen their plan.

Birmingham's Reinvest Northwest initiative focuses on creating significant employment opportunities for prime-age unemployed residents in underprivileged neighborhoods. It plans to set up local service centers providing job training, childcare, and transportation. The project also includes enhancing student opportunities in apprenticeships and internships, and establishing a Black Business Entrepreneurship Center (BBEC) to mentor Black entrepreneurs. The coalition is aiming for \$20M in federal funding to back these initiatives.

The EI Paso Borderplex Region Workforce Recompete Initiative aims to bridge job access gaps for the city's underserved. It will transform workforce challenges by promoting social mobility via short-term technical training in advanced manufacturing, healthcare, and IT. The program will create industry-specific training curricula, provide extensive support services, encourage community participation, and engage businesses. It will also assist in job placements for prime-age workers and their families. Further, the initiative will collaborate with employers to develop and improve career pathways for high school students, offering internships and apprenticeships with existing and new regional companies. El Paso will apply for \$50M in federal funding in phase 2 of the program to support this work.
